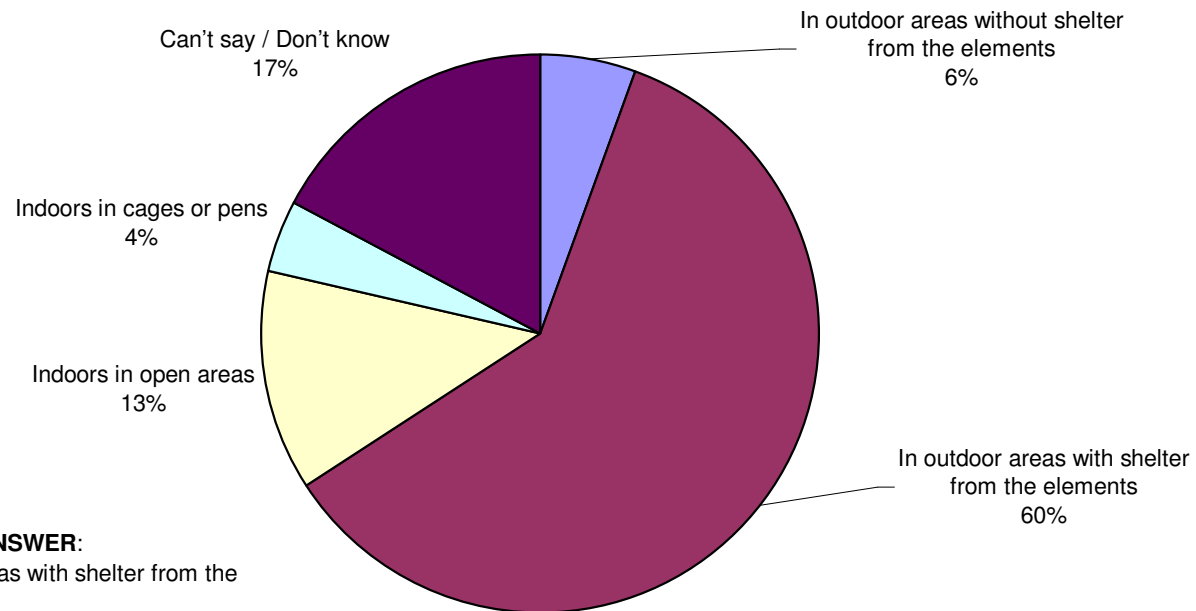


Q1 Animals raised in "free range" conditions are born:

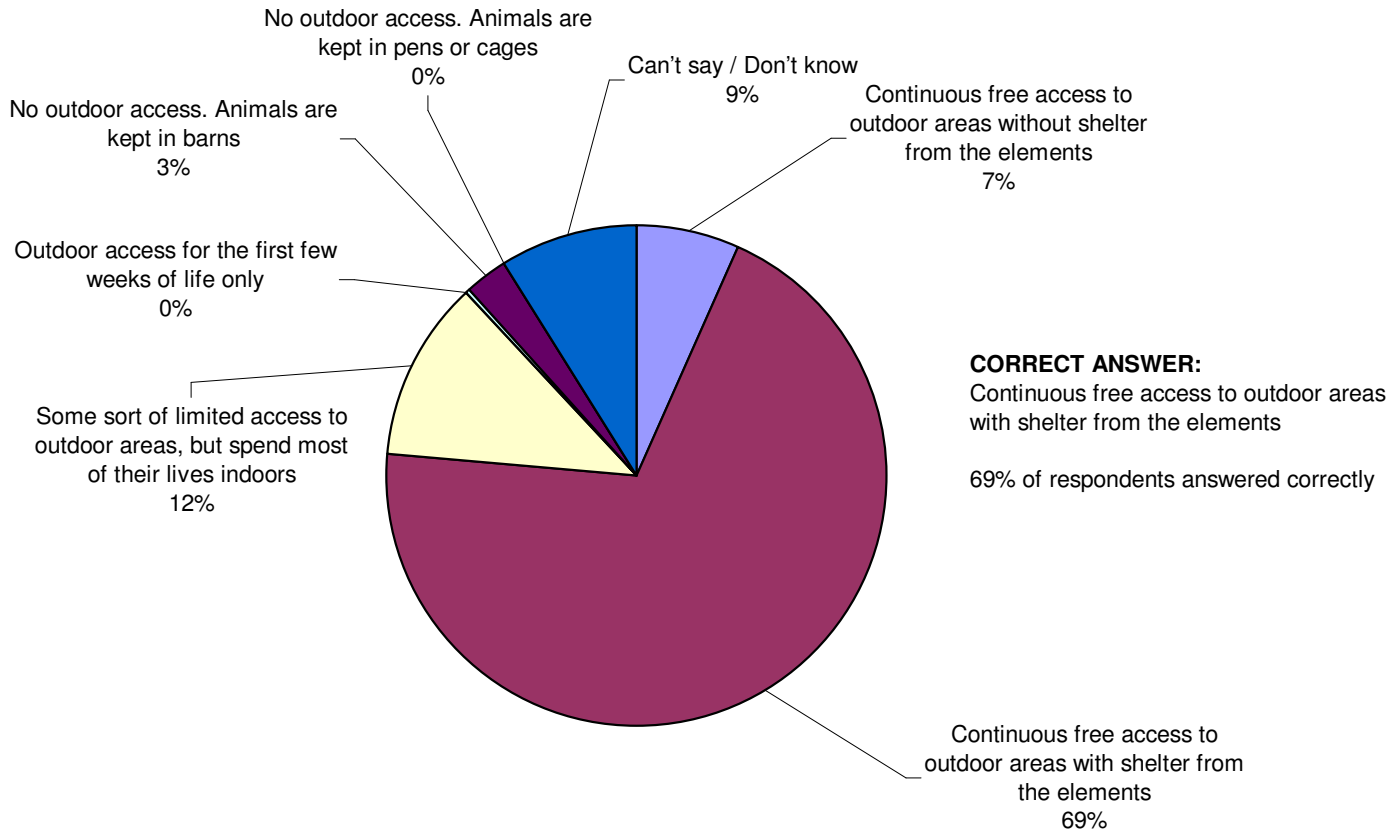


CORRECT ANSWER:

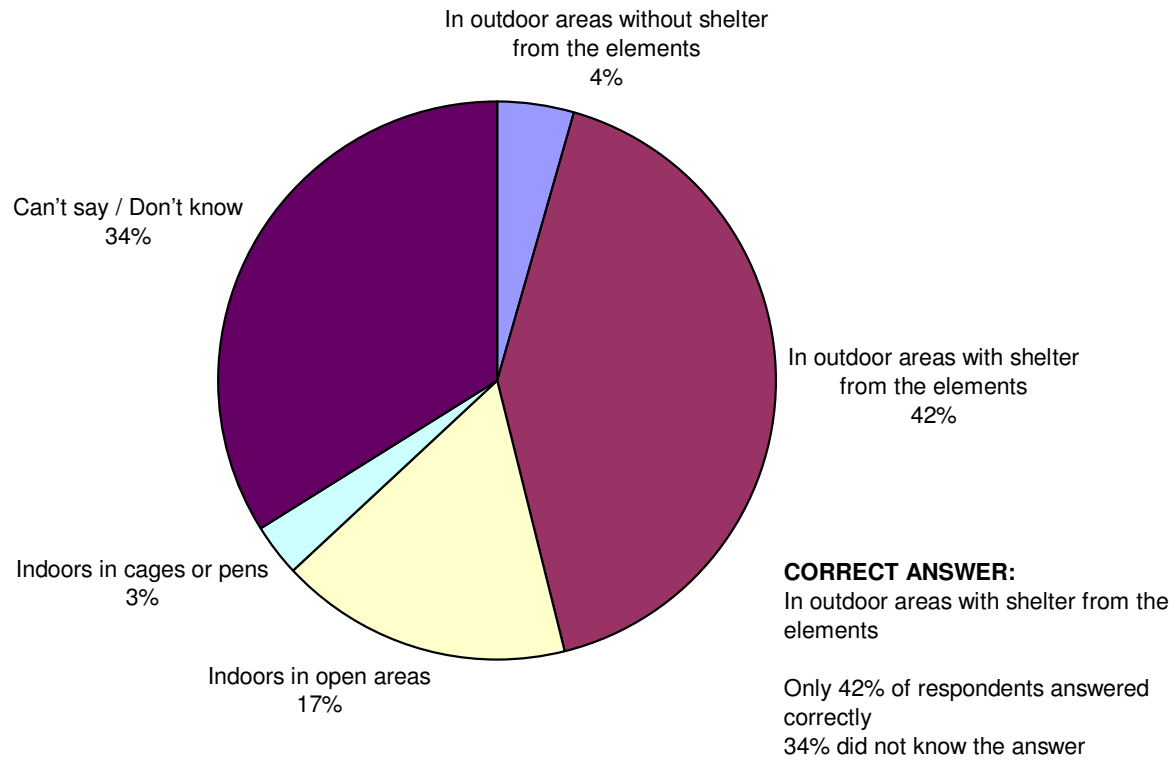
In outdoor areas with shelter from the elements.

40% of respondents did not know or answered differently

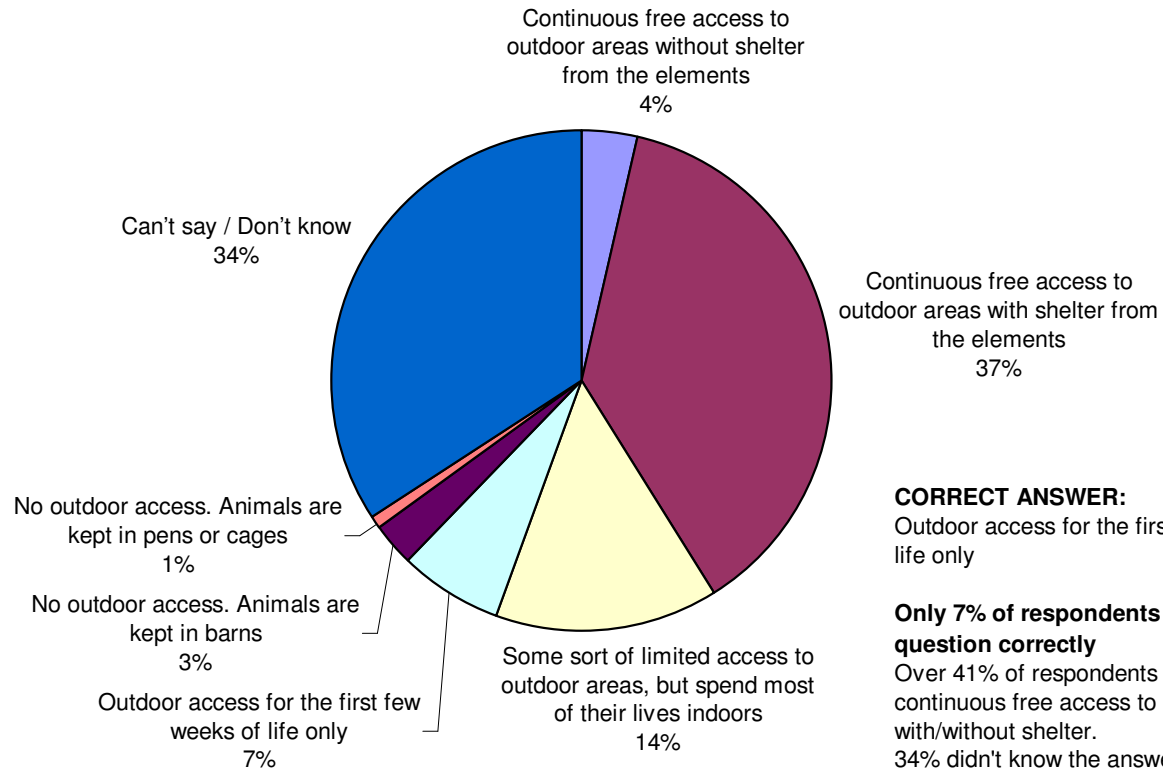
Q2 Animals raised in "free range" conditions have:

Q4 Animals raised in "bred free range" conditions have:



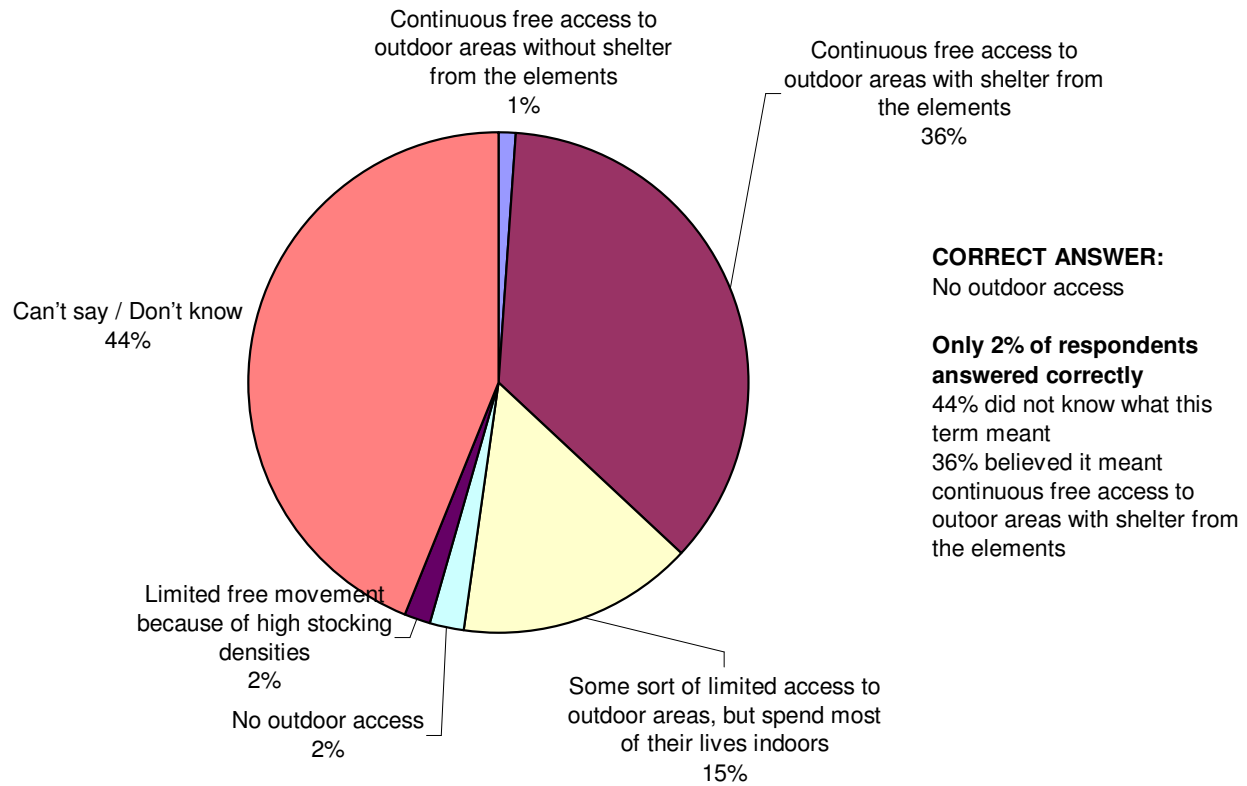
CORRECT ANSWER:

Outdoor access for the first few weeks of life only

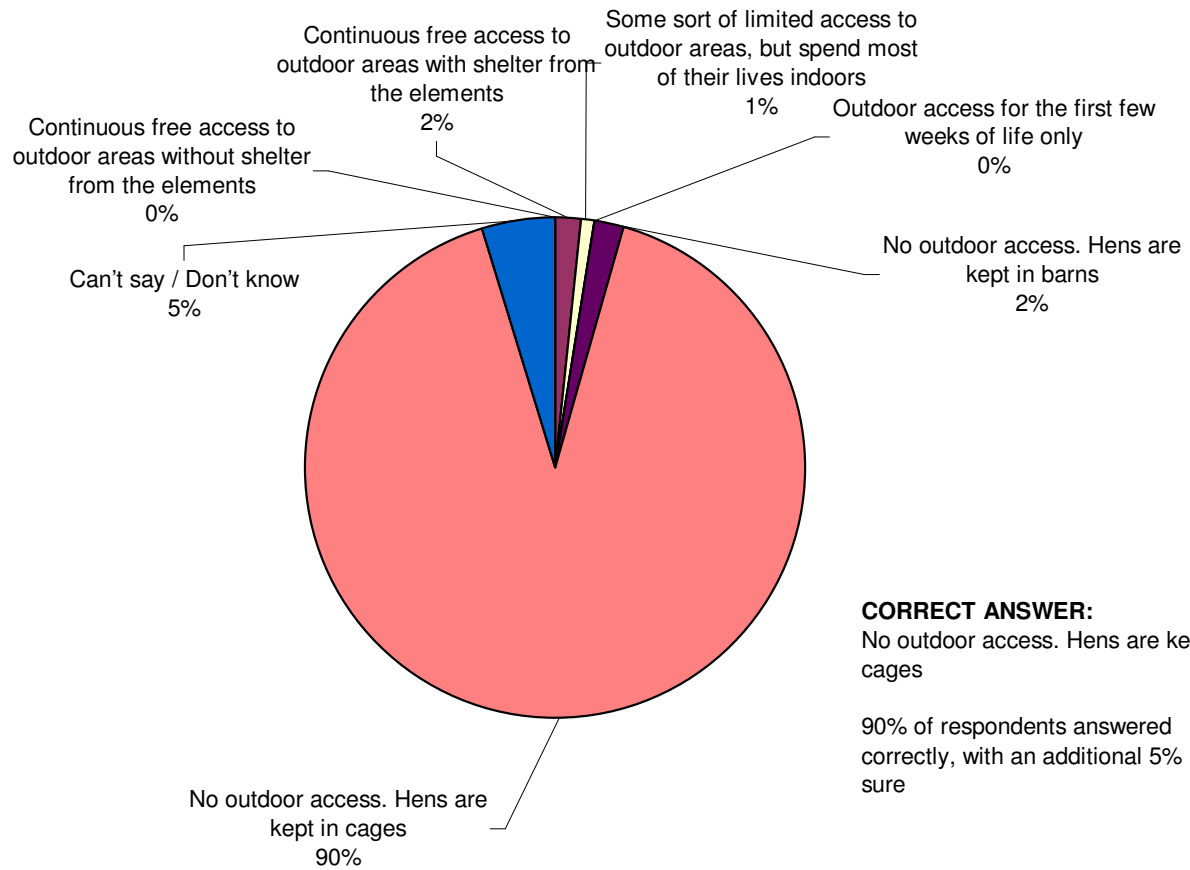
Only 7% of respondents answered this question correctly

Over 41% of respondents believed it meant continuous free access to outdoor areas with/without shelter. 34% didn't know the answer

Q6 Chickens laying "cage eggs" have:

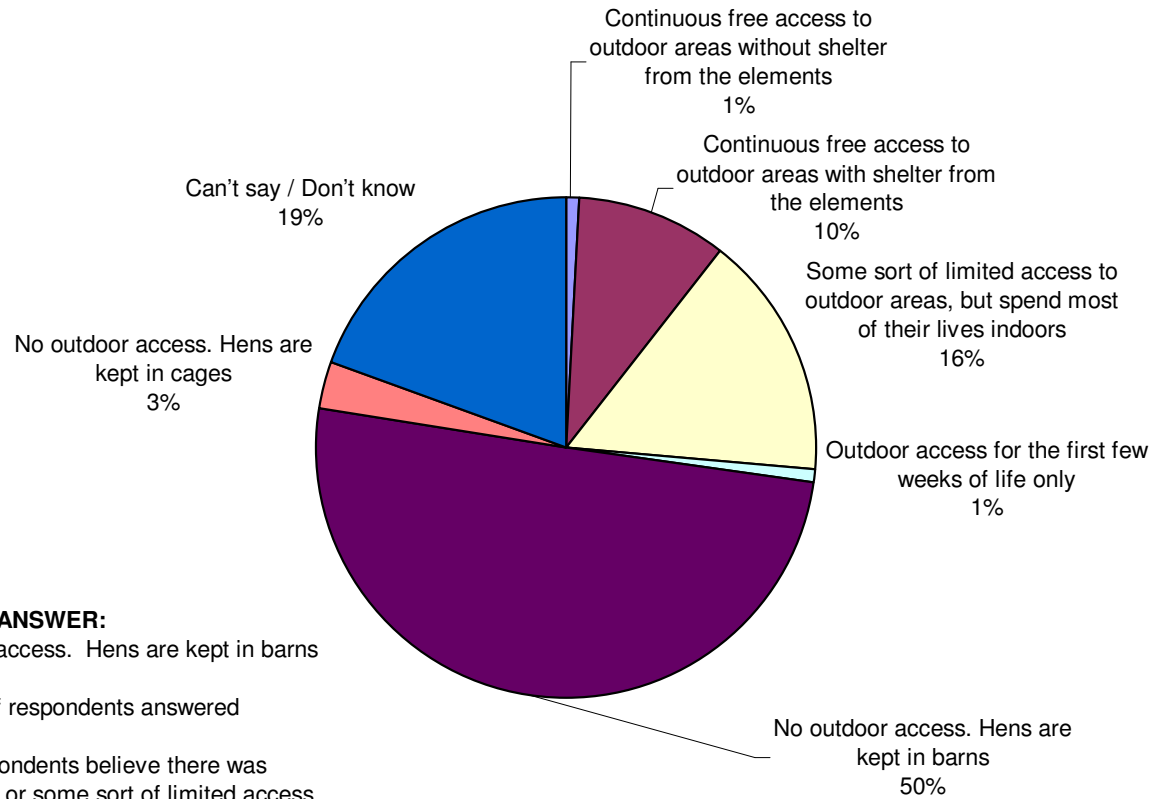


CORRECT ANSWER:

No outdoor access. Hens are kept in cages

90% of respondents answered correctly, with an additional 5% not sure

Q7 Chickens laying "cage-free eggs" have:



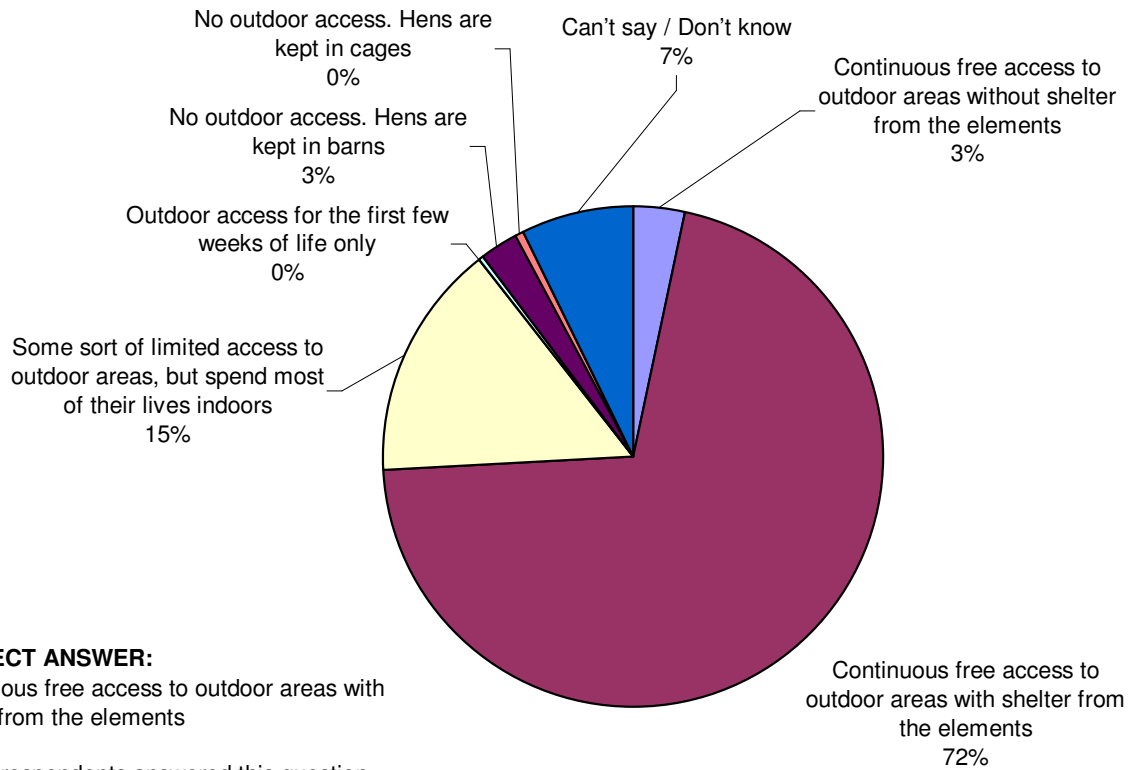
CORRECT ANSWER:

No outdoor access. Hens are kept in barns

Only 50% of respondents answered correctly

26% of respondents believe there was continuous / or some sort of limited access to outdoor areas.

Q8 Chickens laying "free range eggs" have:

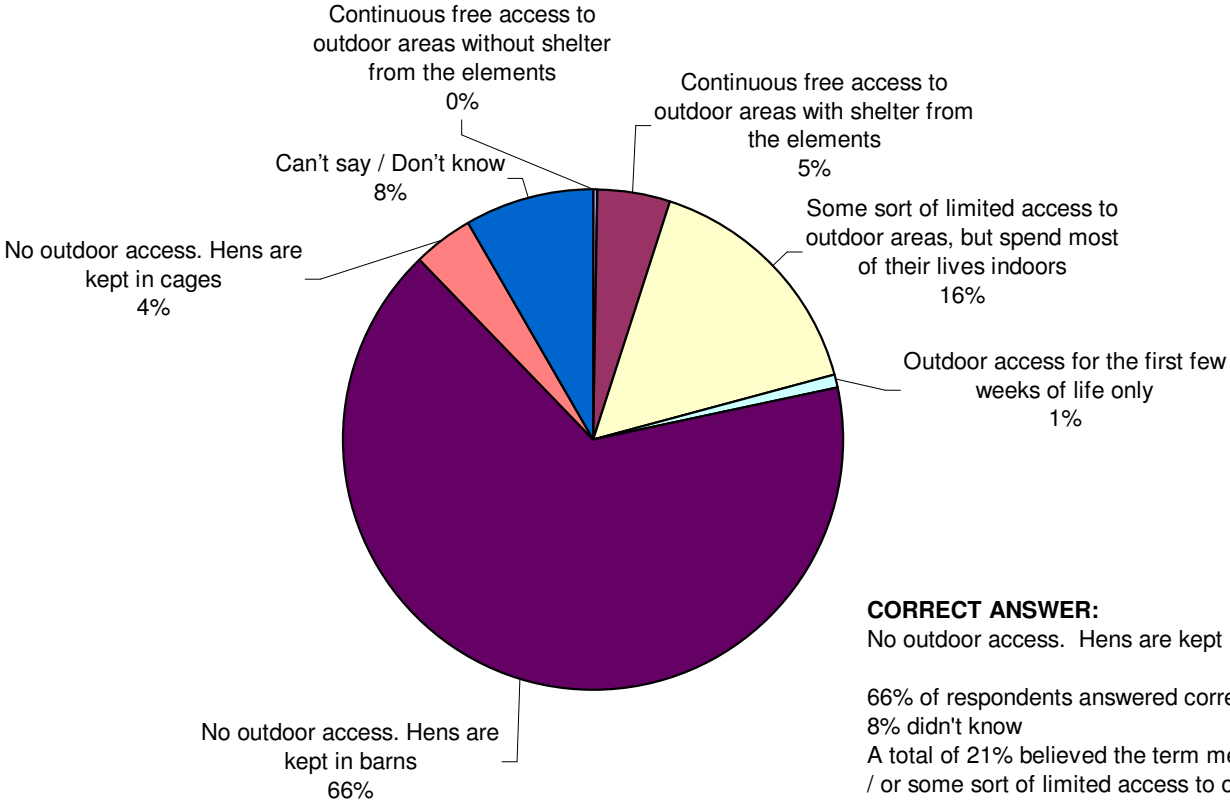


CORRECT ANSWER:

Continuous free access to outdoor areas with shelter from the elements

72% of respondents answered this question correctly

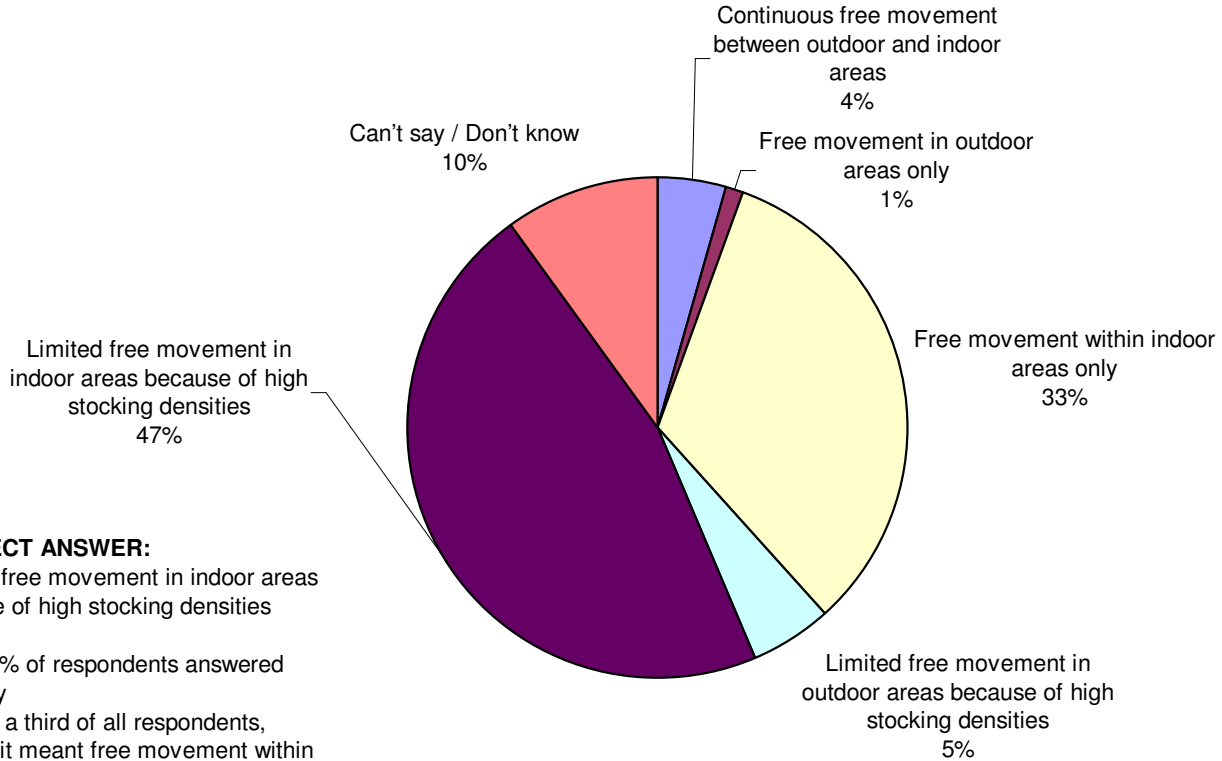
Q9 Chickens laying "barn laid eggs" have:



CORRECT ANSWER:
No outdoor access. Hens are kept in barns

66% of respondents answered correctly.
8% didn't know
A total of 21% believed the term meant continuous / or some sort of limited access to outdoor areas

Q10 Chickens in barns have:

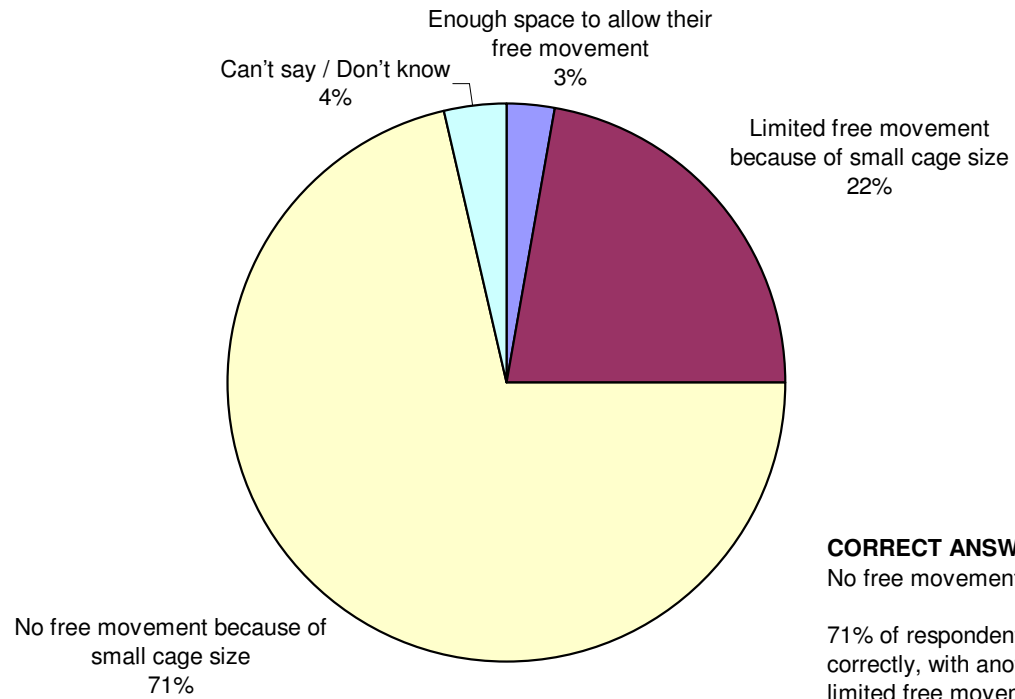


CORRECT ANSWER:

Limited free movement in indoor areas because of high stocking densities

Only 47% of respondents answered correctly
33%, or a third of all respondents, believe it meant free movement within indoor areas

Q11 Chickens in cages have:



CORRECT ANSWER:

No free movement of small cage size

71% of respondents answered correctly, with another 22% believing limited free movement was possible
